




Civil Case Filings - Weighted*






Civil Case Terminations - Weighted*










Criminal Defendant Filings - Weighted*






Criminal Defendant Terminations - Weighted*


Criminal Defendant Terminations - Major Case Type





District Judge Time in Court (Yearly Total for All Judges)




District Judge Time in Court (Yearly Average Per Judge)



Magistrate Judge Time in Court (Civil Hours - Average Per Judge)





Magistrate Judge Time in Court (Criminal Hours - Average Per Judge)

















MJ Preliminary Proceedings Under U.S. 28 § 636(a) - FY2010




MJ Preliminary Proceedings Under U.S. 28 § 636(a) - FY2009





MJ Preliminary Proceedings Under U.S. 28 § 636(a) - FY2008





MJ DUTIES UNDER U.S. 28 § 636(b) - FY2010



MJ DUTIES UNDER U.S. 28 § 636(b) - FY2009




MJ DUTIES UNDER U.S. 28 § 636(b) - FY2008



Magistrate Judge Consent Case Disposition Type























District Judge Time in Court (Yearly Total for All Judges)




District Judge Time in Court (Yearly Average Per Judge)



Magistrate Judge Time in Court (Civil Hours - Average Per Judge)





Magistrate Judge Time in Court (Criminal Hours - Average Per Judge)







MJ Preliminary Proceedings Under U.S. 28 § 636(a) FY2010 Phoenix Division




MJ Preliminary Proceedings Under U.S. 28 § 636(a) FY2009 Phoenix Division



MJ Preliminary Proceedings Under U.S. 28 § 636(a) FY2008 Phoenix Division




MJ Preliminary Proceedings Under U.S. 28 § 636(a) FY2010 Tucson Division



MJ Preliminary Proceedings Under U.S. 28 § 636(a) FY2009 Tucson Division




MJ Preliminary Proceedings Under U.S. 28 § 636(a) FY2008 Tucson Division



MJ DUTIES UNDER U.S. 28 § 636(b) - FY2010 Phoenix




MJ DUTIES UNDER U.S. 28 § 636(b) - FY2009 Phoenix



MJ DUTIES UNDER U.S. 28 § 636(b) - FY2008 Phoenix




MJ DUTIES UNDER U.S. 28 § 636(b) - FY2010 Tucson



MJ DUTIES UNDER U.S. 28 § 636(b) - FY2009 Tucson




MJ DUTIES UNDER U.S. 28 § 636(b) - FY2008 Tucson



Magistrate Judge Consent Case Disposition Type














District Supervision Caseload




Supervision Cases Activated by Office



Average Supervision Caseload Per Officer




Successful Expirations of Supervision Term






